HIRSLANDEN COMPENSATES TIME NEEDED TO CHANGE CLOTHES BY GRANTING ADDITIONAL PAID DAYS OFF

The Hirslanden Private Hospital Group will grant all employees up to 4 further days off with pay if they are obliged to change all their clothes for operational reasons. The new arrangement will come into effect across the whole Group on 1 January 2021.

The solution adopted by the Hirslanden Group with regard to changing time applies to all employees who wear special clothing for their work and who are obliged to change all their clothes outside working hours. At the two Geneva hospitals Clinique La Colline and Clinique des Grangettes, the solution is currently being still evaluated.

Full-time employees will receive an additional four days off on top of their contractual holidays. The additional entitlement to days away from work will be reduced proportionately for part-time employees. The 4 days' off correspond to the average time needed to change clothes across the entire Group. About 80 % of Hirslanden employees will benefit from this new solution.

Focus on employees' needs

The main objective when formulating the Hirslanden changing-time arrangement was to find a Group-wide solution that also focussed on employees' needs.

This "en bloc" settlement satisfies employees' needs for more flexible work and enhances their work-life balance. It was the solution favoured by the employee representatives involved in the project who were drawn from various Hirslanden hospitals, and is consistent across all occupational groups – from nursing to cleaning, catering and housekeeping. Working procedures, breaks, etc. are not affected and remain as before.

"We are delighted with the extremely attractive solution for our employees," stated Markus R. Bechtiger, Chief Human Resources Officer.

An interdisciplinary working group will finalise the details between now and the end of the year ready for implementation.
