Consultation process complete

Regrettably, despite numerous suggestions made during the consultation period, the previously announced mass redundancies cannot be avoided. It is possible, however, to reduce the number of employees affected.

On 1 March 2024, the Executive Committee of the Hirslanden Group announced the planned loss of up to 120 non-patient-facing administrative jobs in the Corporate Office division based in Opfikon/Zurich, up to 80 of which were intended to be reduced via redundancies.

In a consultation process lasting two and a half weeks, employees had the opportunity to submit suggestions as to how redundancies could be avoided, their numbers limited or their consequences mitigated.

Over the past few days, the Executive Committee of the Hirslanden Group has been examining these suggestions in detail and assessing their feasibility.

Regrettably, despite the large number of suggestions, the previously announced mass redundancies cannot be avoided. It is possible, however, to reduce the number of employees affected. In addition to organisational restructuring and staff fluctuations, suggestions made by employees on lasting cuts to personnel costs have meant that the 80 redundancies originally considered can now be reduced to 56.

Hirslanden regrets the consequences of the measures that have been decided, and will do everything in its power to support staff members in finding alternative employment. A redundancy scheme is being drawn up.

Of our patients, 51.7% have basic insurance, 27.5% have semi-private insurance, and 20.8% have private insurance. The Hirslanden Group was formed in 1990 following a merger between several hospitals, and is now part of the Mediclinic Group.
