# Thomas Bührer becomes new hospital manager of Hirslanden Bern

Dr. med. Thomas Bührer will become the new hospital manager of Klinik Beau-Site, Salem-Spital and Klinik Permanence as of 1 August 2023. The former Deputy Hospital Manager and Head of the Medical System Division at Hirslanden Bern succeeds Dr. Daniel Lüscher, who has accepted a position outside Hirslanden as of 1 July 2023. Thomas Bührer has in-depth knowledge of the healthcare sector and a broad track record both as a manager and as a doctor.

Thomas Bührer, 45, started his career by studying human medicine at the University of Basel and obtained his federal medical degree in 2006. After obtaining his doctorate in 2015, he completed his medical training in the same year with a specialist qualification in surgery. In 2017, he obtained an Executive Master in Business Administration from the University of St. Gallen. He also completed a CAS in medical law at the University of Zurich at the end of March 2023.

Thomas Bührer underwent further clinical training in Basel, Liestal, Olten and Solothurn. At the Solothurner Spitäler (soH), Thomas Bührer subsequently took on various management tasks in addition to a clinical role as Senior Consultant on the Surgical Emergency Ward at Bürgerspital Solothurn, most recently as Head of Projects & Special Services in the Medical Directorate. From 2018 to 2021, Thomas Bührer held the position of Deputy Lieutenant Colonel / Chief of the Military Medical Service and was a member of the Executive Board for Medical Services at the Federal Department of Defence, Civil Protection and Sport DDPS.

Since 1 January 2022, Thomas Bührer successfully managed the Medical System division (MES) at Hirslanden Bern, in which all medical cross-sectional functions are combined. As Deputy Hospital Manager since April this year, he is also already actively involved in the strategic orientation of the Bern Hirslanden hospitals. Hirslanden operates a comprehensive medical network in the canton of Bern with a clear focus on excellent integrated care, known as the Hirslanden Continuum of Care, in the areas of the musculoskeletal medicine, cardiac medicine, cancer medicine, neuromedicine, as well as obstetrics. This includes both outpatient and inpatient cooperation in primary care, as well as specialised and highly specialised diagnostics and hospital treatment.

"I am looking forward to the new challenge and, in particular, to further expanding our Continuum of Care in the Bern region, such as with the cross-location, interdisciplinary and certified Bern Biel Breast Centre, which we operate together with Hirslanden Klinik Linde. The two locations mean that patients can choose a place of treatment close to their place of work or residence," says Thomas Bührer.

Stéphan Studer, Chief Operating Officer of the Hirslanden Group, had this to say: "With Thomas Bührer, we have found a hospital manager who is very familiar with the Bern Hirslanden hospitals due to his previous positions at Hirslanden and who also brings valuable medical knowledge to the new position. I hold him in high esteem as an upstanding and highly professional leader with extensive management experience and look forward to working closely with him. He will continue to expand the regional healthcare network internally and also with Hirslanden's cooperation partners in order to further advance population-oriented healthcare in the canton of Bern in a targeted manner." Thomas Bührer succeeds Daniel Lüscher, who has accepted a position outside Hirslanden as Chairman of the Board of the Aarau Cantonal Hospital



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with effect from 1 July 2023. Thomas Bührer will take up his position as Hospital Manager of Hirslanden Bern on 1 August 2023.
