Personnel change in the management of Hirslanden Klinik Aarau

Dr. Markus Meier, Hospital Manager of Hirslanden Klinik Aarau, has been appointed Group General Manager Operational Excellence by the Mediclinic Group (MCG), the parent company of Hirslanden, based on his previous international responsibilities for MCG and his many years of work in Aarau. He is thus relinquishing the management of Hirslanden Klinik Aarau, but will continue to support the hospital in selected strategic projects. Rolf Gilgen will take over the hospital management on an interim basis from 1 October 2023.

Markus Meier (47) has been Hospital Manager of Hirslanden Klinik Aarau since March 2017. He is a doctor of health economics and specialises in model-based planning and optimisation of hospital processes. Under his leadership Hirslanden Klinik Aarau has further established itself as an extremely financially sound hospital and the most cost-efficient centre hospital in Switzerland, while at the same time providing excellent quality data. With a case mix index (CMI) of 1.23, the hospital treats on average the most complex cases in the canton of Aargau. In the current hospital ranking by news magazine Newsweek, Hirslanden Klinik Aarau ranks as number 7 among the best hospitals in Switzerland. Under the leadership of Markus Meier, the new hospital construction project "Schachenallee" was also optimised, the building permit obtained and everything necessary for the start of construction in November 2023 was set in motion.

Integrated care network

During his time as Hospital Manager, he established and expanded various centres of excellence, for example in the field of cardiac medicine and neuromedicine as well as the Aarau Cham Zug Breast Centre which is operated jointly with Hirslanden AndreasKlinik. Thanks to numerous cooperative agreements, a regional integrated care network has been created, for example in cardiology and cardiac surgery through cooperation with Baden Cantonal Hospital (KSB) or also with Klinik Barmelweid in the areas of psychosomatics, pneumology, rehabilitation and radiology. However, the cooperation is not limited to hospitals. For example, residents of the city's nursing homes can count on on-site medical care from Hirslanden Klinik Aarau. Similarly, the private centre hospital has developed an outpatient oncology rehabilitation programme in cooperation with the Cancer League.

All this is in line with Hirslanden's corporate strategy of operating a comprehensive medical network in each care region together with partners with a clear focus on excellent integrated care. This is known as the Hirslanden continuum of care and covers the areas of the musculoskeletal system, cardiac, cancer and neuro-medicine as well as obstetrics.

Rolf Gilgen takes over as interim manager

In his new function, Markus Meier reports directly to the Group Chief Operating Officer of the Mediclinic Group, Koert Pretorius, and will be responsible in particular for optimising Group-wide processes.

Stéphan Studer, Chief Operating Officer of the Hirslanden Group, had this to say: "I would like to thank Markus Meier most sincerely for his enormous commitment over the past years and very much regret that he is leaving Hirslanden Klinik Aarau. At the same time, I am very pleased that we at Hirslanden, as part of the Mediclinic Group, can offer our employees exciting international perspectives."

The search for Markus Meier's successor has already begun. In the meantime, Rolf Gilgen will take over the interim management of Hirslanden Klinik Aarau from 1 October 2023. Last year, Rolf Gilgen was interim head of the two Hirslanden hospitals in eastern Switzerland, Klinik Stephanshorn and Am



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Rosenberg. Markus Meier will continue to support Rolf Gilgen in selected projects, such as the "Schachenallee" construction project.

The Hirslanden Group was formed in 1990 through the merger of several hospitals. It is now part of the Mediclinic Group.
